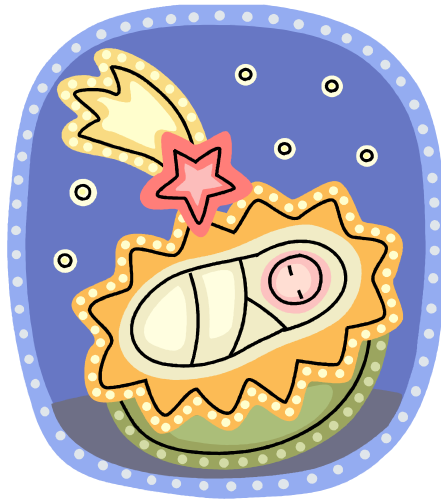

Section 2: Matters of Life and Death

Christian teachings on life after death:

(Please note that the teaching in the revision booklet regarding the resurrection of the dead and the immortality of the soul do not reflect the biblical teaching.)

The Bible teaches that the person who believes that Jesus is the Son of God, (i.e. God in flesh, and the second member of the Holy Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit) that He died for their sins and was raised from the dead, is truly a born again Christian. Now those who are born again, if and when they die, they will be directly in the presence of the Lord Jesus where there will be no judgement. When all those who are to become believers and members of the Church have been saved then Jesus will return for the Church. Those that are dead in Christ will rise first and then those alive in Christ will also be caught up in the air to be with the Lord Jesus. This is purely on the basis of their faith and not by works.

Those that reject the teaching of the Bible regarding Jesus will, at death, be sent to Sheol, the holding place, where they will wait for the Day of Judgement and then they will be resurrected. They will stand before the Great White Throne of Judgement and their works will be judged. On the basis of their life they will be sent to Hell where the fire never ends. This is the plain teaching of the Bible.)

QUESTION 9

(a)	Describe the content of one specifically religious programme (religious broadcast).

Candidates must choose a specifically religious programme such as Songs of Praise, Everyman or Witness and describe its contents. The programme must be a religious broadcast, NOT a soap opera, drama or sit-com.

Award marks as follows

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Candidates must choose a religious theme from a film or TV drama (allow sit-coms and serious cartoons such as *The Simpsons*, BUT NOT soap operas or documentaries). There could be a variety of ways of explaining whether the treatment was fair to religious people:

- they could give reasons why it was fair,
- or why it was not fair,
- or some reasons for and some reasons against.
